Diagnostic	<ul> <li>ERCP is an endoscopic procedure used to identify the presence of stones, tumors, or narrowing in the biliary &amp; pancreatic ducts</li> <li>ERCP can also help find cancer or non-cancerous lesions</li> <li>After the endoscope with x-ray is properly placed, a catheter is advanced which will inject a contrast agent through the ducts</li> <li>ERCP can help diagnose problems following gallbladder surgery</li> </ul>

Therapeutic	<ul> <li>Gallstones can be removed from the bile duct &amp; sometimes from the pancreas</li> <li>ERCP to put in a small plastic tube called a "stent" if your bile duct is blocked</li> <li>ERCP can help treat problems following gallbladder surgery</li> </ul>

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## **Financial**

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	Clearance
Cardiac Hematology Neurology Pulmonary	<ul> <li>You may need a clearance if you have high risk conditions requiring clearance</li> <li>You may need a follow-up with your Doctor or Provider before they can issue a clearance</li> <li>Our team will send your Doctor or Provider a clearance request from our office</li> <li>Once our team has your clearance on file, we will call you to schedule your procedure</li> <li>You may need a clearance if you are on blood thinners or these medications <ul> <li>Apixaban   Eliquis</li> <li>Clopidogrel   Plavix</li> <li>Dabigatran   Pradaxa</li> <li>Edoxaban   Savaysa</li> <li>Prasugrel   Effient</li> <li>Rivaroxaban   Xarelto</li> <li>Ticagrelor   Brilinta</li> <li>Warfarin   Coumadin &amp; Jantoven</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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	Medications
2 Weeks Before	<ul> <li>Hold - GLP1 Agonist Medication:</li> <li>Dulaglutide (Trulicity)</li> <li>Exenatide (Byetta)</li> <li>Exenatide Extended Release (Bydureon BCise)</li> <li>Liraglutide (Victoza)</li> <li>Lixisenatide (Adlyxin)</li> <li>Semaglutide (Ozempic, Wegovy, Rybelsus)</li> <li>Tirzepatide (Mounjaro)</li> </ul>
1 Week Before	<ul> <li>Hold &gt; Anti-Diarrheal Medication - Imodium, Kaopectate, Pepto-Bismol</li> <li>Hold &gt; Iron Tablets</li> <li>Hold &gt; Multivitamins</li> </ul>
1 Day Before	<ul> <li>Hold &gt; Oral Diabetes Medication</li> <li>Insulin &gt; Take ½ the dose</li> </ul>
Procedure Day	Blood Pressure Medication > as instructed by the pre-assessment team
Other	<ul> <li>Continue to take your medications unless specified below</li> <li>Blood thinners will require a clearance on file before scheduling</li> <li>The pre-assessment team (PAT) will review your medications &amp; may make other recommendations also</li> </ul>

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Diet Instructions	
1 Day Before	<ul> <li>Stop - All food after 12am - midnight</li> <li>Stop - All liquids after 12am - midnight</li> </ul>
Procedure Day	No food or liquids on the procedure day

	Procedure Day
Diet	No food or liquids on the procedure day
Arrival	<ul> <li>Please ensure you arrive 1-1.5 hours before your procedure</li> <li>You will check in at registration when you arrive</li> </ul>
Pre-Procedure	<ul> <li>The clinical team will go through the clinical assessment as well as risks &amp; benefits of the procedure</li> <li>The anesthesia team will explain all aspects before the procedure</li> <li>Consent forms the procedure will need to be signed</li> </ul>

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Sedation	<ul> <li>An intravenous line will be inserted into your arm to administer medication</li> <li>You will be given intravenous sedation medication during the procedure</li> </ul>
Position	You will be instructed to lie on the left side with your knees up to your chest
Visualization	After sedation, the endoscope with x-ray is inserted through the mouth & gently advanced to visualize the biliary pancreatic ducts
Diagnostic	<ul> <li>If any diagnostic tissue samples or biopsies are required it can be obtained through the endoscope with x-ray during the procedure</li> <li>Biopsies may be taken</li> </ul>
Therapeutic	<ul> <li>If intervention is required, it will be done during the procedure</li> <li>Stones, strictures may be removed &amp; photographs may be taken</li> </ul>

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Pathologist	<ul> <li>Biopsies are tissue samples that are reviewed by a Pathologist under the microscope</li> <li>The Pathologist will determine the nature of the tissue samples</li> <li>The Pathologist will send the reports to our office</li> </ul>
Follow-Up	<ul> <li>Our providers will review the report in detail</li> <li>The findings will be reviewed with you in detail upon follow-up</li> </ul>

Af	ter Your Procedure
Recovery	<ul> <li>You will be under observation for 30 minutes to monitor for any symptoms</li> <li>You will be awake within 30 minutes but may still be groggy for 12-24 hours</li> <li>Do not plan to drive the remainder of the day after your procedure</li> </ul>
Transportation	<ul> <li>Do not plan to drive after your procedure</li> <li>You must have someone 18 years old or above to drive you home</li> <li>No Uber   Lyft   Cab</li> </ul>

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Symptoms	Normal post procedure symptoms:      Bloating     Gas     Slight abdominal pain     Some diarrhea     Weakness  Abnormal post procedure symptoms:     Bleeding     Excessive vomiting     Fever > 100     Severe abdominal pain     Any other severe or unusual symptoms
Appointment	Please call 911 & go to the nearest emergency room  Ensure that you have a follow-up 2-3 weeks after the procedure
